School Meals

The price of a school dinner is £2.60. Part of the schools funding is based on the number of pupils in receipt of FREE SCHOOL MEALS. Even if your child may not wish to avail of a school dinner please consider making the application if you think your child is entitled to free school meals. Children are also welcome to bring a packed lunch to school.

Snacks

All Year 1 and 2 pupils will be provided with a snack at break-time in the child's own classroom – this costs £1.50 per child per week. Year 3-7 pupils may order toast from the school meals kitchen at a cost of 30p per round. The order should be placed with your child's class teacher. Pupils may also choose to bring a healthy snack to school for midmorning break.

Food Allergies

We are an Allergy Aware school and have a number of pupils in school with food allergies. To help ensure their safety and well-being in school it is vitally important that you do not send any nuts or nut products into school. Please check all food packaging to ensure they are nut free. Your help and support in this matter is very much appreciated.

School Fund
